



2025 Impact Report

SAIN is an all-volunteer, foster-based animal rescue serving Skagit County and surrounding communities.

Our Mission: to prevent and respond to animal cruelty and neglect, primarily in support of law enforcement.

Our Work

Foster-based Rescue & Rehoming

Working primarily with law enforcement, we receive horses and livestock suffering from abuse or neglect and place them in approved foster homes — where SAIN funds their veterinary care, farrier work, nutrition, and training. In 2025, 10 horses moved through our foster program and 5 found their forever homes. No shelter. No staff. Just a community of dedicated volunteers giving animals the individualized care they need to heal and find their people.

Animal Assistance Program

We offer emergency nano-grants to help people care for their animals during times of financial hardship. In 2025, we provided 87 grants to families across Skagit County.

Skagit Pet Pantries

We distributed 12 pallets of dog and cat food to 14 local food banks through our partnership with Community Action of Skagit County.

December 2025 Flood Response

When floods hit Skagit County in December, SAIN volunteers mobilized to coordinate animal food donations and distribution — and set up a peer-to-peer exchange connecting neighbors who could help with those who needed evacuation support or temporary safe housing for their animals.

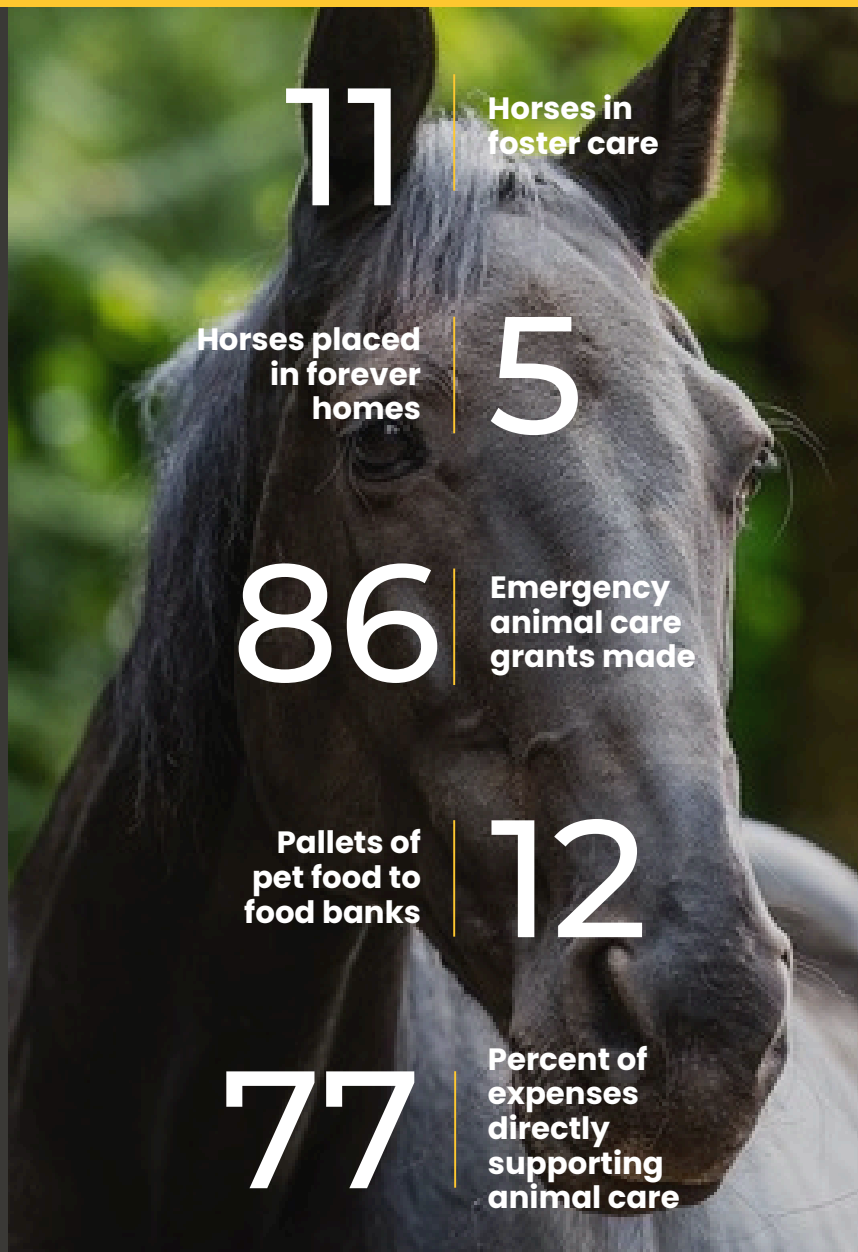
